

GENERAL INFORMATION FOR JERSEY POST CRICKET LEAGUES 2017

Accidents and Incidents

Teams are asked to ensure that any accidents and incidents that may occur at the cricket grounds are reported to the ground staff i.e. cars being damaged at FB Fields, injury to players etc.

Balls going into the Table Tennis Building Gutters

Teams are requested to advise the Ground staff and the Jersey Table Tennis Association if cricket balls are lodged in the Table Tennis Building gutters. JTJA by telephone 01534 615835 or email at info.jtta@gmail.com.

Dogs on the cricket playing areas and surroundings

Players, officials and supporters are requested not to bring dogs onto the playing areas and surroundings of the cricket areas.

Fines for Scratching Matches

A team scratching a match, in any of the Leagues (Evening, Indoor or Weekend) shall forfeit maximum points to the other team and will pay the full cost of the pitch. After a team scratches three matches they will normally be expelled from the League, however the League Management Committee does have the right to use management discretion.

Please note that the Booking Office has advised that they require 48 hours notice for cancellation of matches.

Fencing at Grainville

Cricketers must not use the fence near the tennis courts to hit balls into the signage.

Helmets

As per guidance from the ECB the League Management Committee recommend that all players should wear helmets for their own safety. A list of helmets which are of British Standard is available from the ECB.

First Aid Kits

Due to the reduction in groundstaff there is no guarantee that a groundsman will be at each States grounds when matches are being played. This could mean that a first aid kit is not available when required (the first aid kits in the groundsman's office is for their use). Teams are advised to carry a basic first aid kit with each team.
